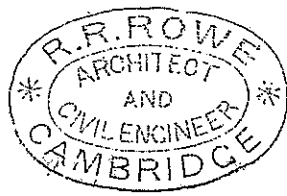


Architect's bill

Richard Reynolds Rowe was a Cambridge architect who designed The Cambridge Corn Exchange and specialised in Church restorations, including Horseheath Church in 1875. He worked on the School, now The Village Hall, along with a 'Teacher's Residence' now in private hands.

and Specification and obtained Tender for execution
of the work from Messrs Mason & Son, which was
accepted - Attended Rev^d J. Butler and received
instructions to prepare Design for Teachers Residence -
Surveyed site and Prepared Design accordingly -
Prepared a Design for a Cheaper house with
less accommodation, which was adopted -
Prepared working and detail drawings sections,
elevations and Specification and obtained Tender for
Teachers Residence from Messrs Mason & Son which

was accepted - Prepared and sent to the
 Revd C. W. Underwood the Secretary of the
 Diocesan Board of Education copies of the Drawings
 of the New School and Teachers Residence for
 the purpose of obtaining a grant in aid of the
 work - Superintended execution of the whole work
 by numerous visits of Self and Assistants -
 Measured up extras and Examined and certified
 the following accounts:-
